**PROPOSALS INVOLVING GENERAL MANDATES

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

1. INTRODUCTION

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 19 May 2016, resolutions of the Shareholders were passed, amongst other things, to give general unconditional mandates to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to:

- (1) repurchase Shares representing up to 10% of the total number of the issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution;

- (2) allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of the issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution; and
- (3) extend the general mandate for issuing Shares as mentioned in paragraph (2) above by an amount representing the total number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the general mandate granted to the Directors to repurchase Shares as mentioned in paragraph (1) above.

The above general mandates shall lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. It is therefore proposed to seek your approval of the Ordinary Resolutions at the AGM to grant fresh general mandates to the Directors.

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the proposals for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate, the Share Issue Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate and the re-election of retiring Directors and to seek your approval of the Resolutions relating to these matters at the AGM.

2. GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the forthcoming AGM to grant to the Directors the Repurchase Mandate, details of which are set out in the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A) to give a fresh general mandate to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to repurchase Shares during the period as set out in the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A) approving the Repurchase Mandate. The Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate shall not exceed 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A) approving the Repurchase Mandate.

An explanatory statement as required under the Share Buy-Back Rules to be sent to the Shareholders, which provides certain information regarding the Repurchase Mandate, is set out in Appendix I hereto.

3. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

Two ordinary resolutions, namely Ordinary Resolutions Nos. 4(B) and 4(C) will be proposed at the AGM to grant to the Directors (i) a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with new Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(B), representing 708,222,566 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date; and (ii) an extension to such general mandate so granted to the Directors by adding thereto any Shares repurchased by the Company since the grant of such general mandate up to 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A).

The existing mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares will expire upon the conclusion of the AGM. The Directors consider that the Share Issue Mandate and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate by adding any Shares repurchased by the Company can increase the flexibility in the Company's affairs and are in the interest of the Shareholders and that the same shall continue to be adopted by the Company.

Details of the Share Issue Mandate and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate are respectively set out in Ordinary Resolutions Nos. 4(B) and 4(C).

4. RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of nine Directors, namely Messrs. Tang Yui Man Francis (Chairman of the Board), Xiang Ya Bo (Chief Executive Officer) and Chen Wei, being the executive Directors, Messrs. Ou Yaping, Ou Jin Yi Hugo and Law Sze Lai, being the non-executive Directors and Messrs. Tian Jin, Xiang Bing and Xin Luo Lin, being the independent non-executive Directors.

In accordance with Bye-law 87(1) of the Bye-laws, Messrs. Xiang Ya Bo, Law Sze Lai and Xin Luo Lin, being Directors who have been longest in office since their last re-election, shall retire by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, would offer themselves for re-election.

Pursuant to Code Provision A.4.3 of the Corporate Governance Code set out in Appendix 14 to the Listing Rules, if an independent non-executive director serves more than nine years, his further appointment should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders. Mr. Xin Luo Lin has been an independent non-executive Director for more than nine years. The Board believes that he is still independent as he has not held any executive or management position in the Group since his appointment. In performing his role as an independent non-executive Director, Mr. Xin Luo Lin has been exercising independent judgment not in any way affected by his length of service to the Company. Mr. Xin Luo Lin has also provided the Company with an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Hence, the Board comes to the view that Mr. Xin Luo Lin should be re-elected and therefore recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of the resolution for his re-election. In this regard, a separate resolution will be put forward at the AGM to re-elect Mr. Xin Luo Lin as an independent non-executive Director.

Details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II hereto.

5. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

The AGM Notice which contains, inter alia, the Ordinary Resolutions for the Repurchase Mandate, the Share Issue Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors are set out on pages 13 to 17 of this circular.

To the best of the Directors' knowledge, information and belief, having made all reasonable enquiries, no Shareholder is required to abstain from voting on the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, any vote of Shareholders taken at the AGM to approve the resolutions proposed must be taken by poll, and an announcement will be made by the Company after the AGM on the poll results of the AGM.

The register of members of the Company will be closed from Monday, 15 May 2017 to Thursday, 18 May 2017, both days inclusive, during which period no share transfer will be effected. In order to identify the entitlement for attending the AGM, all transfers accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at Shops 1712-1716, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, 12 May 2017.

6. ACTION TO BE TAKEN

A proxy form for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you propose to attend the AGM in person, you are requested to complete the proxy form in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return it to the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding of the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the proxy form will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjourned meeting (as the case may be).

7. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that the proposals for the Repurchase Mandate, the Share Issue Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that you should vote in favour of all relevant resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

1. LISTING RULES

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their own shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions. This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required to be sent to Shareholders in connection with the proposed general mandate for repurchase of Shares by the Share Buy-Back Rules.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders for the Directors to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

3. SHARE CAPITAL

Based on the 3,541,112,832 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date, and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 354,111,283 Shares during the period as set out in the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A), representing not more than 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the memorandum of association of the Company and Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda and Hong Kong. It is proposed that repurchases of Shares under the Repurchase Mandate in these circumstances would be financed from available cash flow or working capital facilities of the Company and its subsidiaries. The Companies Act provides that the amount of capital repayable in connection with a repurchase of Shares may only be paid out of the capital paid up on such Shares or out of the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the proceeds of a new issue of Shares made for the purpose. The Companies Act further provides that the amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of the funds of the Company otherwise available for dividend or distribution or out of the Company's share premium account. Such repurchase may only be made if on the effective date of purchase, there are no reasonable grounds for believing that the Company is, and after the purchase would be, unable to pay its debts as they fall due.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts for the year ended 31 December 2016 contained in the Annual Report) in the event that the powers granted pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate is to be exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which, in the opinion of the Directors, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. GENERAL

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Mandate if the same is approved by the Shareholders at the AGM and exercised by the Board.

No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that it/he has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders and exercised by the Board.

The Repurchase Mandate will expire upon the earliest of: (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws or the Companies Act or any other applicable laws of Bermuda to be held; or (iii) the passing of an ordinary resolution by the Shareholders in general meeting revoking or varying the authority given to the Directors by the Ordinary Resolution No. 4(A).

7. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of a repurchase of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of and increase in the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 and Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, according to the register of members maintained under section 336 of the SFO, Mr. Ou Yaping together with his associates were interested in 1,597,568,660 Shares, representing approximately 45.11% of the issued Shares. Based on such interest and in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, the interest of Mr. Ou Yaping together with his associates in the Company will be increased to approximately 50.13% of the issued Shares and an obligation to make a general offer may arise. Save as mentioned above, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of an exercise of the Repurchase Mandate. The Directors have no intention to repurchase any Shares to the extent that it will trigger the obligations under the Takeovers Code to make a mandatory offer.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, the number of Shares held by the public will not fall below 25%.

8. SHARES REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

No repurchase of Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) has been made by the Company in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

The details of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out as follows:

(1) MR. XIANG YA BO

Mr. Xiang Ya Bo, aged 60, was appointed as an executive director of the Company in 2011 and the chief executive officer in August 2013. He is the chairman and the general manager of Sinolink Properties Limited, a subsidiary of the Company. He is a brother of Mr. Ou Yaping, a non-executive director and a substantial shareholder of the Company and is an uncle of Mr. Ou Jin Yi Hugo, a non-executive director of the Company. He graduated with an engineering degree. Mr. Xiang has over 30 years of experience in the field of corporate management, investment management and technical administration on computer technologies and e-commerce. He was an executive director and a member of remuneration committee of Enerchina Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange, from May 2002 to 14 June 2016. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Xiang has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Pursuant to the service agreement entered into between Mr. Xiang and the Company on 24 March 2017, Mr. Xiang was appointed for a term of three years and is subject to retirement and re-election provisions in the Bye-laws. He is entitled to annual salary of RMB1,000,000 and HK\$1,780,012 payable in 13 instalments and discretionary year-end management bonus. His remuneration is determined by the Board based on the review and recommendation from the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company's performance and the prevailing market situation.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, save as disclosed above, Mr. Xiang did not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management of the Company, substantial or controlling Shareholders and had personal interest in share options granted by the Company to subscribe for 35,000,000 Shares.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Xiang does not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

(2) MR. LAW SZE LAI

Mr. Law Sze Lai, aged 74, was appointed as an executive director of the Company in December 1997 and redesignated as a non-executive director in September 2007. He is also the chairman of supervisory committee of Sinolink Properties Limited. Mr. Law was employed by a number of real estate companies in the PRC. He is a qualified economist in the PRC and has over 25 years of experience in property development. Mr. Law joined the Group in 1992. Mr. Law did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Pursuant to the letter of appointment entered into between Mr. Law and the Company on 6 December 2016, Mr. Law was appointed for a term of one year and is subject to retirement and re-election provisions of bye-laws and he is entitled to annual remuneration of HK\$1,400,000 which are determined by the Board based on the review and recommendation from the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company's performance and the prevailing market situation.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Law has interests in 9,005,500 Shares, representing approximately 0.25% of the issued share capital of the Company. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Law does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management of the Company, substantial or controlling Shareholders nor have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

(3) MR. XIN LUO LIN

Mr. Xin Luo Lin, aged 68, was appointed as an independent non-executive director of the Company in June 2002. He is also the chairman of audit committee and remuneration committee and a member of nomination committee of the Company. Mr. Xin is a postgraduate from the Peking University in PRC. He was a research associate at the Waseda University in Japan, an honorary research associate at the University of British Columbia, Canada and a visiting fellow at the University of Adelaide, Australia from 1984 to 1985. He was appointed as a Justice of the Peace in New South Wales of Australia in 1991. Mr. Xin is a co-author of a book titled “China’s iron and steel industry policy: implications for Australia”. Mr. Xin is also an independent non-executive director, member of audit committee and remuneration committee of Central China Real Estate Limited; a non-executive director and honorary chairman of Asian Capital Holdings Limited and an independent non-executive director, member of audit committee, remuneration committee and nomination committee of ASR Logistics Holdings Limited and a non-executive director of China Trends Holdings Limited, all are listed companies on the Stock Exchange. Mr. Xin is a director of Mori Denki Mfg. Co., Ltd., a public company listed on the Tokyo Stock Exchange and a director and the vice chairman of Oriental Technologies Investment Limited, a listed company on the Australian Stock Exchange. Mr. Xin was an independent non-executive director of China Environmental Technology Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange, from 2011 to 2015; and he was a non-executive director of Enerchina Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange, until May 2016. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Xin has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the past three years.

Pursuant to the letter of appointment entered into between Mr. Xin and the Company on 6 December 2016, Mr. Xin is appointed for a term of one year and is subject to retirement and re-election provisions in the Bye-laws. He is entitled to an annual remuneration of HK\$250,000 payable in two equal instalments which is determined by the Board (with Shareholders’ authorization) based on the review and recommendation from the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company’s performance and the prevailing market situation.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Xin did not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management of the Company, substantial or controlling Shareholders and had personal interest in share options granted by the Company to subscribe for 2,000,000 Shares.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Xin does not have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Save as disclosed above and as at the Latest Practicable Date, each of the above Directors did not hold any other positions in the Group. Other than the aforesaid, in relation to each of the above retiring Directors, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required

to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provision under Rules 13.51(2) (h) to 13.51(2) (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders in relation to the re-election of the above retiring Directors.
